#### Notes to the accounts

The financial statement has been prepared (1) in accordance with the Charity Commission Statement of Recommended Practice together with applicable accounting standards (2) on a cash basis and (3) under the historical cost convention. Income is recognised when it is due. Direct income relates to the promotion of the society's objects through the use of the Theatre. Grants, interest and tax recoverable are accounted for when received. Hire income is recognised when the hire is due. Expenditure is accounted for on receipt of the invoice. Figures are shown net of VAT; within the Partial Exemption regulation some Input Tax was recovered. The Queen Mother Theatre is built on land which is leased from North Herts District Council for a term of 99 years from 1983; the rent for the whole term was paid then. The Trustees discontinued depreciation in 2002.

### **EXAMINER'S REPORT**

This report on the accounts of the Bancroft Players for the year ended 30 June 2014, which are set out in the Annual Report, is in respect of an examination carried out under Section 43 of the Charities Act 1993. As the trustees of the Bancroft Players you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts; you consider that the audit requirement of section 43(2) of the Charities Act (1993) do not apply. It is my responsibility to issue this report in accordance with the terms of Regulation 7 of the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 1995. My examination was carried out in accordance with the general directions given by the Charities Commission under section 43(7)(b) and to be found in the Directions and Guidance Notes issued by the Charities Commission. That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the Bancroft Players and a comparison of the accounts with those records. It also includes considering any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts. In connection with the examination, no matter has come to my attention which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements to keep accounting records in accordance with section 41 of the Act to prepare accounts which accord with the accounting records and comply with the requirements of the Act, have not been met; or to which in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.
